



## **SUGGESTIONS**For Using This Daily Plan Book

This Plan Book has been developed with the idea of stimulating objective lesson planning.

The list of Objectives and Procedures given is necessarily broad and general and no attempt has been made to list them in order of their importance. It is expected that teachers will find many new and different objectives based on needs of their own group and spaces are provided for listing them.

You may list your objective by number or write it out, as you prefer. It is hoped that by keeping the list of objectives before you as you compose your lesson plans that better planned lessons will result.

A well-planned program is an essential, for a teacher needs a lesson plan just as a builder needs a set of blueprints. Successful teachers agree that well-planned lessons are already half taught. A well-planned lesson is one that exposes the subject matter by means of thought provoking questions. Be brief yet explicit in your plans; still make them detailed enough so that a substitute may understand them and carry on. We have provided lesson plan blocks large enough for much detail writing.

Revise and correct your plans for future reference. Note effective plans which produced good results. Form this habit for future growth and improvement. Your Plan Book should become a valuable reference material for successive years. Continued reference to past lesson plans will lead to better work each year.

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
