

# **FUNdamentals of Handwriting**









#### KINDERGARTEN THROUGH

#### 2ND GRADE

#### Handwriting is fundamental to early writing development1, the act of turning simple letter writing into complex written expression.

 It's crucial for reading, too. Handwriting increases brain activity and leads to better letter perception than typing or viewing text.2

#### 3RD GRADE THROUGH MIDDLE SCHOOL

- Mastering handwriting fluency helps kids keep up with their developing minds<sup>3</sup>, leading to better academic performance.4
- Kids write more, write faster and write better when they handwrite essays compared to typing.5

#### HIGH SCHOOL THROUGH COLLEGE

- Test performance improves when study notes are handwritten rather than typed.6
- Music played at a low volume can help students focus and improve fluency of handwriting.7

#### ADULTHOOD, **PARENTHOOD \$BEYOND**

- Handwritten notes boost memory and lead to better long-term recall than typing.6
- More moms said they would prefer a hand-made card from their kids over a professional massage.8
