## Handbook Margin Guide

If you would prefer to set up your own document to match our specifications rather than using a template, adjust the page size and margins according to the product size ordered:

5 x 8	
Page Width:	5"
Page Height:	7.93"
Top Margin:	0.31"
Bottom Margin:	0.38"
Side Margins:	0.58"

8 x 10	
Page Width:	7.87"
Page Height:	10.25"
Top Margin:	0.5"
Bottom Margin:	0.57"
Side Margins:	0.77"

To ensure your handbook will fit the planner you've ordered, make sure you place all content within the specified margin areas. You may find it helpful to make the text boundaries visible; in Word, (PC) go to File > Options > Advanced, scroll down to Show Document Content, and click on Show Text Boundaries or (Mac) Word > Preferences > View and click on Text Boundaries under Show.

If you're having trouble adjusting your artwork to fit, check out Premier's Artwork Services.

**Note:** Handbooks print using black ink only. For best results, use only black text and black or grayscale graphics. We ask that all colored artwork, including images and hyperlinks, be converted to black or gray. Be sure to check your artwork carefully, as some colors or color combinations do not translate well into gray.

## Handbook Setup Q&A

- Q: Does each sheet in the finished agenda count as one page or two?
- A: One page = one side of a sheet of paper. The title page in the front counts as one page of your total, though, so your custom handbook should be (at most) one page less than the number of pages included in the package you've chosen.
- Q: I have a handbook set up using a Premier template from a previous year, and the margin settings don't match the the ones listed here.
- A: We've revised the settings to make it less likely that your content will have to be scaled down, and to make it easier to see how your handbook will actually appear in the finished agenda. We recommend converting your artwork to use the new settings.
- Q: How do I set up the first page to fit the window in the front cover?
- A: Title pages are now created separately from the rest of the handbook. When you submit your artwork, you'll have the opportunity to specify the text and graphics you'd like to appear on your title page.
- Q: These pages look pretty crowded. Can I make the margins wider?
- A: Of course! The margin settings listed are just the minimum width necessary for your content to fit on the page. Just remember that wider margins will mean you won't be able to fit as much on each page.
- Q: My handbook includes tables that have borders extending out into the margins. Will that cause problems?
- A: As long as it's just the table border, you're probably OK. If the text part of the table extends out into the margins, it's not going to fit.
- Q: So I shouldn't put page borders or clip art in the margins?
- A: Not unless you've made the text area smaller to make room for them. If you want the look of graphics in the margins, you can make the margins wider or use hanging indents to contain the text.
- Q: What happens if I can't get my handbook to totally fit these margins?
- A: It will automatically be scaled down when you submit it. However, depending on your design, it might scale down more than you want, or it might not all scale down consistently. For the highest print quality, we recommend setting up everything to fit before submitting your artwork.
